Course Description

Angela M. Snell, M.S.Ed, MT-BC is a seasoned educational consultant and school music therapist employed by the Monroe County Intermediate School District, Monroe, Michigan. She has recognized expertise in early childhood through post-secondary development, autism spectrum disorders, intellectual disabilities, behavior disorders, inclusion, classroom consultation, and special education law. She designed a countywide related service delivery model that emphasizes special education collaboration and integration with general education and the community. As a result, several lasting programs have developed including an annual countywide integrated music program, annual age-appropriate curriculum collaborative programs, an adapted playground, parent-child workshops, and technology-enhanced educational peer-outreach programs. Angie holds a Bachelor of Music Therapy from Michigan State University, a Master of Science in Educational Leadership from Capella University and a Specialist of Arts in Special Education Administration from Eastern Michigan University. She directs university-affiliated internships and practicum students and serves as an adjunct professor at Saint Mary of the Woods College. Angie has served in various state, regional, and national leadership roles which currently include Assembly Representative to the National Board of Directors for the American Music Therapy Association, 2016-17 Speaker of the AMTA Assembly Delegates, GLR-AMTA Government Relations Chair, and Special Learners Chair for the Michigan Music Educators Association. Angie is a regional and national presenter, author, and advocate on related topics. While she has authored multiple book chapters, her most recent contributions include the Forward in Music Therapy Social Skills Assessment and Documentation Manual (MTSSA) (Rook, et al, 2014) and contributing author in the Early Childhood Music Therapy and Autism Spectrum Disorders: Developing Potential in Young Children and their Families (Kern & Humpal, 2012).



*From Chicago:

Take I-94 north to Milwaukee. Take the Howard/Holt Avenue exit. Exit on Holt and go west (left). Holt becomes Morgan Avenue. Continue going west to 43rd Street (2.5 miles). Turn right on 43rd Street. The main entrance to campus will be on your right.

From Green Bay:

Take I-43 south to Milwaukee. Proceed to I-94 toward Chicago. Exit on Holt Avenue, go west. Holt becomes Morgan Avenue. Continue going west to 43rd Street (2.5 miles). Turn right on 43rd Street. The main entrance to campus will be on your right.

From Madison:

Take I-94 east to Milwaukee to Miller Park Way (south). Miller Park Way becomes 43rd Street. Continue south on 43rd Street past Oklahoma Avenue. The main entrance to the college will be on your left.

From Mitchell International Airport:

Take the Downtown Milwaukee exit and go north on I-94. Take the Howard/Holt Avenue exit. Exit on Holt and go west (left). Holt becomes Morgan Avenue. Continue west to 43rd Street (2.5 miles). Turn right on 43rd Street. The main entrance to campus will be on your right.
