Course Description

This course will provide participants with an overview of trauma and how it impacts clients. Based in the modern understanding that trauma is a whole-body experience, participants will increase their understanding of the neurobiological processes that take place, as well as explore how music therapy can address a variety of trauma symptoms. Participants will be encouraged to reflect on their own experiences and considerations for self-care and vicarious resilience will be discussed.

Learner Objectives:

Jennifer Sokira, MMT, LCAT, MT-BC is a Board Certified Music Therapist with over 15 years of experience and she is currently the music therapist at the Resiliency Center of Newtown. She has extensive experience working with clients who have experienced violent community trauma, as well as grief/end of life needs as well as developmental needs.

As music therapist at the Resiliency Center of Newtown Jennifer provides trauma-informed music therapy to children and adults who were impacted by the 12/14/12 tragedy at Sandy Hook School. In addition to her role as a therapist she assists with developing and implementing the center's supportive and therapeutic programming.

Jennifer is also the founder and Executive Director of Connecticut Music Therapy Services, LLC which she established in 2005 and which has grown to a 10 person agency that provides quality music therapy services to children and adults with developmental health, brain health and wellness needs as well as consultation to individuals, schools and agencies.

She is currently an advanced trainee in the Bonny Method of Guided Imagery in Music as well as a Level 2 trainee in Brainspotting. She has authored two chapters and a published research study is a regular presenter locally, regionally and nationally on topics including trauma- informed care, ethics, and on various topics in music therapy business including practice building and marketing. She is Past-President of the New England Region of the American Music Therapy Association, and is also an appointed member of the AMTA Ethics Board.



*From Chicago:

Take I-94 north to Milwaukee. Take the Howard/Holt Avenue exit. Exit on Holt and go west (left). Holt becomes Morgan Avenue. Continue going west to 43rd Street (2.5 miles). Turn right on 43rd Street. The main entrance to campus will be on your right.

From Green Bay:

Take I-43 south to Milwaukee. Proceed to I-94 toward Chicago. Exit on Holt Avenue, go west. Holt becomes Morgan Avenue. Continue going west to 43rd Street (2.5 miles). Turn right on 43rd Street. The main entrance to campus will be on your right.

From Madison:

Take I-94 east to Milwaukee to Miller Park Way (south). Miller Park Way becomes 43rd Street. Continue south on 43rd Street past Oklahoma Avenue. The main entrance to the college will be on your left.

From Mitchell International Airport:
